

How many base stations are there in Senegal



Overview

France has officially handed over its two remaining military bases in Senegal, leaving the onetime colonial power with no permanent presence in either West or Central Africa. It was the first step to a complete withdrawal of French soldiers and the return of the sites by the end of 2025. This move follows President Bassirou Diomaye Faye's announcement to reduce reliance on foreign military presence.
