

# Santo domingo electricity distribution



## Overview

The power sector in the Dominican Republic has traditionally been, and still is, a bottleneck to the country's economic growth. A prolonged electricity crisis and ineffective remedial measures have led to a vicious cycle of regular blackouts, high operating costs of the distribution companies. CEPM is a private electricity company in the Dominican Republic that generates, transmits, distributes, and commercializes energy in the tourist areas of Punta Cana, Bávaro, Verón, Macao, Uvero Alto, Miches, Bayahíbe, and La Romana, with an installed and under-construction capacity of over 600 MW. The World Bank has greenlit a new initiative in the Dominican Republic, investing \$225 million to enhance the country's electricity sector. This project aims to significantly reduce the high distribution losses in electricity by rehabilitating distribution networks, upgrading management technology. The Dominican government's push for a more “just, efficient, and sustainable” electricity system saw a major operation as the Empresa Distribuidora de Electricidad del Este (Edeeste), the power distribution company, has joined forces with the Prosecutor's Office for the Electrical System (Pgase) to.
