This was 1993, back when people like me were first discovering Hong Kong cinema, and martial artists flying around on wires seemed like the greatest discovery since their primary antagonist, gravity. For a solid thirty years, it was a filmmaking powerhouse — second only to Hollywood in sheer output and global reach. The heyday of Shaw Brothers, Golden Harvest, and later Milkyway Image gave us some of the most entertaining. Classic films like “*A Star is Born*” (1937) showcased Esther Blodgett's transformation from rural girl with natural waves to polished star with controlled curls, visually representing her character development. Similarly, films of the 1950s and 60s often portrayed characters with tight curls as.
